1. St. Patrick's Day is an Irish national holiday w/banks, stores & businesses closing for the day.
2. The first St. Patrick's Day celebration in the US was held in Boston (1737).
3. Shamrocks are the national flower/emblem of Ireland.
4. The color of St. Patrick's Day was originally blue.
5. Beer is one of the most widely consumed beverages on St. Patrick's Day.
6. Legend says that each leaf of the clover has a meaning: Hope, Faith, Love & Luck.
7. 1962 marked the first time Chicago dyed their river green for St. Patrick's Day.
8. There are 34.7 million US residents w/Irish ancestry.
9. Your odds of finding a four-leaf clover are about 1 in 10,000.
10. The world's shortest St. Patrick's Day parade is held in an Irish village. It lasts only 100 yards, between the village's two pubs.
